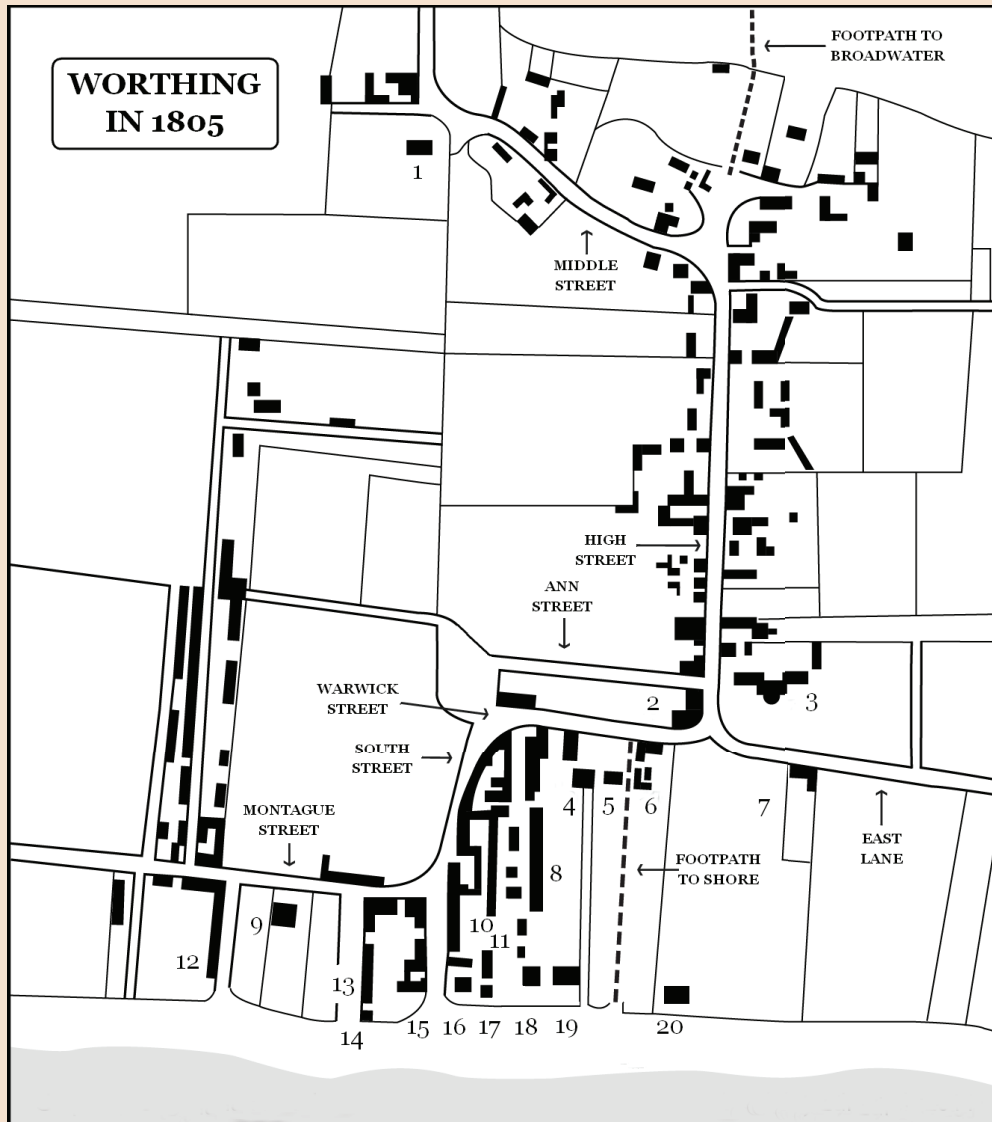




# Map of Worthing in 1805

This partly conjectural map – originally prepared for Antony Edmonds's book *Jane Austen's Worthing: The Real Sanditon* – is based on a map printed in the 1814 edition of John Evans's *A Picture of Worthing*. Buildings known not to have been present in 1805 have been removed. Inevitably there are areas of uncertainty, and in particular it is difficult to be sure how much of the area north of Montague Street was already built in 1805.

The buildings marked with an asterisk survive today. All the others are long gone.
